

OTHER DEVELOPMENTS

- On August 28, the website of Voice of America's (VOA) Turkish service was <u>blocked</u> across Turkey after the international broadcaster refused to file a license application as demanded by the government's broadcast regulator RTÜK.
- A Diyarbakır court <u>extended</u> the pre-trial detention of Mezopotamya Agency's (MA) reporter <u>Fırat Can</u> <u>Arslan</u>, who has been <u>in custody since July 25</u> for allegedly "identifying officials on anti-terror duties as targets".
