


Monthly Factsheet: December 2024



Trial Monitoring

In December, at least **33 journalists faced trial. Of these, 13 hearings were adjourned, and 5 journalists were acquitted. 3 journalists were imprisoned, while one was fined.** Most charges against the journalists involved defamation and terrorism-related offenses.

2 Kurdish journalists were killed. 30 journalists were detained. 7 of them were arrested.

Journalists increasingly subjected to judicial control measures. Journalists Nazım Daştan and Cihan Bilgin were <u>killed</u> in a suspected Turkish drone strike while reporting in Syria.

Following the killing of Daştan and Bilgin, Turkish authorities <u>detained</u> 30 journalists during solidarity protests, with 7 arrested on terrorism charges.

Özlem Gürses was <u>detained</u> and later <u>placed under house</u> arrest due to her remarks about the Turkish military on her YouTube channel.

Nevşin Mengü was briefly detained over a YouTube interview with a Syrian Kurdish group executive and is now under a foreign travel ban. <u>Read our statement for details</u>.
