

Monthly Factsheet: January 2025



Trial Monitoring

In January, at least **90 journalists stood trial. 23 of the hearings were adjourned. 9 journalists were sentenced to prison. 7 journalists were acquitted.** In these trials, most journalists were charged with defamation and terrorism-related crimes.

At least 6 journalists sentenced to prison, 23 investigated and one faced police obstruction.




